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MINUTES of the MEETING of the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FEBRUARY 17, 2015

1. Call to Order: Mr. Scoggin called the meeting to order 4:45 p.m.

Board Members Present: Yusef Scoggin; Jeff Miner; Dennis Overton; Tiffany Small Boyd

2. Project Updates

A. Public Safety, Jim Whyte

- 1) TCF Supplemental Patrols, 2015 Contract The contract language remains the same as the 2014 contract. After review, Ms. Boyd made a motion to approve the contract as written. Mr. Miner seconded the motion and the contract was unanimously approved.
- 2) It was agreed that the crime reports will be added to the CWE SouthEast website.
- 3) Neighborhood Security Initiative Mr. Whyte reported that he regularly communicates with the police department and neighborhood institutions re. security, including Cortex and BJC to coordinate efforts.
 - a. Monthly Crime Reports Mr. Whyte reviewed the January 2015 statistics which showed one less crime compared to January 2014.
 - b. Camera Project The camera installation is complete as proposed except for the Laclede/Newstead location at Park Place Apartments (4399 Forest Park Ave.). Mr. Whyte has had an initial conversation with and is to meet with the owners of 4400 Laclede to talk with them about installing the cameras on their building. He said that the camera on the rear of Growing Green (3954 West Pine) does not
 - adequately cover the alley and needs to be relocated. Mr. Whyte requested a contact for the West Pine Lofts. Ms. Anderson will make the introduction via e-mail.
- B. Neighborhood Stabilization, Ron Coleman
 - 1) 3945 West Pine Mr. Coleman said that the former ACI Plastics building (just west of Café Ventana) is scheduled for demolition in March. A seventy-seven unit apartment building will be constructed (scheduled to open 2019).
 - 2) Street Lights, 41-4200 West Pine There was a general discussion re., specifically a damaged pole and light head on that block. Ms. Anderson will check with Gelinda Connell about a previous survey of the street lights. The topic was tabled for the next meeting.
 - 3) Fire Hydrants Mr. Coleman reported that the Water Division confirmed that the fire hydrants are operational.
 - 4) Dog Waste Stations Board members and residents report a constant problem with dog owners who do not clean up after their dog. Mr. Coleman will request signage installed.
- C. Streetscape Maintenance & Landscaping A planter at the West Pine/Boyle intersection is damaged. CWE SouthEast was approached to replace the planter. Ms. Anderson said that the

Mr. Miner requested Laura Cohen be contacted as she is preparing a proposal for CWE SouthEast's financial participation in maintenance of the Forest Park Avenue islands and cul de sac gardens in the neighborhood. Ms. Anderson will do so, explaining the limitations of the ordinance.

3. Ordinary Business

- A. Approval of Minutes, December 16, 2014 Mr. Miner made a motion to approve the December 2014 minutes as written. Ms. Boyd seconded and the minutes were unanimously approved. As a quorum was unavailable for the January 2015 meeting, meeting notes were presented but do not require approval.
- B. Financial Reports: Resolution re. Project Manager Change and Bank Account Administration Mr. Scoggin explained the need for this resolution. Mr. Miner made a motion to approve the resolution as presented. Ms. Boyd seconded and the resolution was unanimously approved. The bank statements were not received. No financial report was submitted.

C. Board Membership

- 1) Recruitment Status: Ralph Wafer and Jason Wilson Ms. Anderson contacted Mr. Wafer. He has retired, closed his business and has moved out of the CWE (required for a board seat). She will stop in at Northwest Coffee to talk to Mr. Wilson.
- 2) Conflict of Interest Form Board members present submitted a signed conflict of interest form.
- 4. Other Business to Come Before the Board Following up on the conversation begun re. item 2B, Ms. Anderson confirmed that the current ordinance expires 2018. Mr. Scoggin said that the Board needs to consider the future of the SBD, to renew or not as well as consideration of the term, the boundaries and the scope of projects outlined in the ordinance.
 - Ms. Anderson will research the cost of renewing the ordinance and the scope of work provided in other area SBD and CID ordinances.
- 5. Adjournment There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 5:44 p.m.
