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MINIUTES of the MEETING of the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS Tuesday, August 18, 2015

1. Call to Order: Mr. Scoggin called the meeting to order at 4:35 p.m.

2. Project Updates

A. Public Safety: In lieu of the regular public safety presentation, Mr. Scoggin described recent CWE Neighborhood Security Initiative Board conversations regarding potential NSI program growth and how CWE SouthEast could benefit and participate. It has been suggested that data provided by NSI could be improved, including Field Interview Reports (FIRs), calls for service (resulting in a case), arrests made, and trial outcomes, etc., that could include comparisons with the previous month, and year. The board agreed that NSI efforts and operations should be transparent, and that these reports should include race and gender, believing that not knowing is indefensible.

Board members suggested child safety education, expanded offers of anti-theft clubs for cars, contributions to a gun-buy-back program and safety presentation at Washington and St. Louis University's student orientation. Ms. Anderson will ask the West Pine-Laclede Neighborhood Association about use of their membership database for outreach.

Panhandling continues to be an issue. Ms. Anderson will talk to social work interns working with Park Central about developing a list of nearby social service agencies for production of a business-type card that could be given to panhandlers.

Ms. Anderson noted that NSI is funded solely with tax-generated funds from special business and community improvement districts. As such, a request for proposal re. patrol services should be opened every three to five years in order to comply with the laws which govern these districts.

Mr. Scoggin said he understood that Mr. Whyte (NSI) was to speak with Colonel O'Toole (SLMPD) re. the police department providing the same insurance coverage received by on-duty officers to officers working a secondary job for by a special business district or community improvement

- district. He is to present this request based on the officer providing police service to the community and those services are paid for by tax dollars.
- B. Neighborhood Stabilization, Ron Coleman No report made.
- C. Streetscape Maintenance No report made.

3. Ordinary Business

- A. Approval of Minutes: Ms. Pesapane made a motion to approve the July 2015 minutes as presented. Mr. Overton seconded and the minutes were unanimously approved.
- B. Financial Reports: Ms. Anderson reviewed the financial reports, saying that there were no unexpected expenditures. Mr. Miner made a motion to approve the financial reports as submitted. Ms. Pesapane seconded the motion and the reports were unanimously approved.
- C. Board Membership: Open Board Seat (renter): Ms. Anderson said that a staff person from The Block attended a recent West Pine-Laclede Neighborhood Association meeting and indicated to her that Marc del Pietro, owner of The Block at 33 N. Sarah is interested in serving on this Board. Mr. del Pietro owns the business and is a renter, fulfilling the ordinance requirement. The Board agreed that Ms. Anderson should meet with him and then invite him to the September meeting.
- 4. Other Business to Come Before the Board Ms. Anderson said that she had unsuccessfully searched for bylaws. The Board agreed that she should draft bylaws using other SBD and CID bylaws as an example. Park Central Development generally has one or two Washington University law interns; an attorney at Bryan-Cave reviews all of their work before it is finalized. This process allows the SBDs and CIDs managed by Park Central to receive the majority of their legal services without charge.
- 5. Adjournment: There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:05 p.m.
