

In our vision, Trailnet identifies several core values that help us reach our goal of creating vibrant and prosperous communities. We recognize that the power of place helps energize and animate neighborhoods into places that inspire pride, stewardship, social cohesion, and economic prosperity.

In 2018, Trailnet conducted a walk audit with St. Louis University Occupational Therapy students and identified the need for safer ways to cross Vandeventer at Laclede. In 2019, we identified an unused public space on the corner of Laclede Avenue and Vandeventer Avenue as an opportunity to enhance power of place in the Central West End neighborhood. The idea started with a parklet - a former street space now designed for people to stop, rest, and socialize. After conversations with numerous partners, the idea evolved from improving one space with a parklet to improving the entire area around the intersection into a space that invites and encourages people to utilize the community around them. With support from SE SBD, Alderman Joe Roddy, and St. Louis University, completion of new continental crosswalks initiated the first phase of improvements. We are now planning for possible installation of a mural and bike improvements on Laclede Avenue as further improvements for this space. Trailnet received initial funding through an AARP grant to pay for the planning and design phases of the parklet.

The parklet is the focal point of this project and has been identified as the next phase of improvements. Throughout the planning process, Trailnet has worked with partners to design and identify an affordable method to help bring the project to fruition. From the materials and bids presented to the SBD commissioners, Trailnet is formally asking the Central West End Southeast Special Business District to fund the construction of the parklet with funds that will not exceed \$12,000. This financial support will fund the cost of materials, labor, and other associated construction costs to complete the project.

In partnership with the SBD, we have a unique opportunity to create a space for people by constructing the first parklet in the City of St. Louis. We believe this project will be a great success for the neighborhood and a model for similar placemaking projects in St. Louis. We hope to see this project move forward as quickly as possible and would be more than willing to discuss financials, planning details, or any other questions about the project.

1. Call to order

- a. Y. Scoggin called the meeting to order at 5:11 pm.
- 2. Chair's Report & Announcement of the Order of Business: Introductions

3. Public Comments:

- a. Trailnet- Parklet Update: They have received three proposals for construction. Custom Rehabs was the least expensive, had the fastest construction time, and is a local company. While there has been no official choice yet, Trailnet will most likely choose Custom Rehabs. They will come back to the board with a monetary request by next meeting. If Trailnet needs to request City/Ward dollars for the project, the BID process will have to be redone and the project will be delayed.
- b. Median Planters- D. Gualdoni presented the Median Planter project. The Alderman has committed to 1/3 of the cost. Cortex has committed to 1/3 of the cost not to exceed a certain amount. She requests that the SBD commit to the final 1/3 of the cost. M. Michener motioned to commit to 1/3 of the cost with an upper limit of \$10,000 for the first year and \$2,500 per year the second and third years. J. Miner seconded the motion. All in favor—approved.

4. Public Safety

- **a. Fraud** A. Abdullah updated the Board on the bank fraud. A detective is investigating. The IP address is from Nigeria, but they do not know where the fraud originated. The SBD filed an insurance claim from MOPERM and are still waiting for a response.
- **b. NSI Update** J. Whyte presented the NSI Security Reports. Crime is slightly up for the first two months of 2020. There is a new reporting system that will be happening next year called NIBRS. There will appear to be an increase in crime because of the way it will be reported.
- c. TCF Update- R. Betts gave an update for COVID-19. It will be difficult to staff during this time due to shortages across the city. Shifts for police are increasing and there will be fewer officers available for secondary shifts.

5. Neighborhood Stabilization:

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a. R. Coleman reported the following- The city is still waiting on BIDS for lighting outages on the 4300 and 4400 block of Laclede. J+A Bar has been getting complaints and claim to have been broken into. Forestry will continue to provide service and plan to remove more than 50 trees over the next month.

6. Approval of February Meeting Minutes

a. J. Miner motioned to approve February 19th, 2020 meeting minutes. Seconded by M. Michener. All in favor—Motion approved.

7. Project Reports:

a. Financial Reports- K. Oberle presented the Financial reports. J. Miner would like to open new bank account to ensure all money is protected by FDIC insurance. Y. Scoggin is in support. PCD will look into banks and present them at next meeting.

8. Other:

- a. Resident Feedback- PCD has listed web address on website, still working on getting a comprehensive list for condo association. Y. Scoggin would like a timeline for feedback received. He also recommends posting the link on the WPLNA website.
- **b. Board Seats-** T. Boyd is resigning. Y. Scoggin will forward official resignation to PCD. Board members should reach out to interested community members.
- c. Lighting- R. Coleman is working the lighting commissioner to find out why some lights are not turning on. He will keep the Board updated. There is a request that PCD add West Pine and Sarah lighting problems to the map.
